<p>Objectives and expected results</p>	<p>Progress, as measured by independent organisations, has been achieved in the areas identified under the partnership for democracy as being of key importance for strengthening democracy, the rule of law and the respect of human rights and fundamental freedoms.</p> <p>The relevant Council of Europe conventions opened for signature to non-member countries are signed and ratified.</p> <p>Parliamentary committees, parliamentarians and parliamentary staff have gained wide exposure and understanding of Council of Europe relevant standards in the areas of human rights, democratic standards, rule of law, making use of these standards in their work whenever relevant.</p> <p>Members of the parliament of Jordan become acquainted with European parliamentary and political practices and with Council of Europe standards, in view of a possible future institutionalised co-operation with the Assembly (including, under Partnership for Democracy status).</p> <p>Technical capacities of the secretariats are strengthened through wide exposure to the standards of the Council of Europe in its core areas of work (human rights, including social rights, democratic standards, rule of law),</p> <p>Best practices in constitutional reform are shared, in co-operation with the Venice Commission.</p> <p>Closer interaction between the Parliament of Jordan, its Committees and civil society organisations, in the core areas of work of the Council of Europe, are established.</p> <p>Development of a regional dialogue at Parliamentary level between the Southern neighbourhood countries (Morocco, Tunisia, Egypt, Jordan, Palestinian Territories, Lebanon and Algeria) aimed at sharing experience in democratic governance</p>
