CONCEPT PAPER

1. Background

On the occasion of the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, the Romanian Parliament and the Parliamentary Network "Women Free from Violence" of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe will organise a regional conference on the Council of Europe Convention on preventing and combating violence against women and domestic violence (Istanbul Convention) in Bucharest on 25 November 2013.

The conference aims at raising awareness of the phenomenon of violence against women and signalling the political commitment of the Romanian and other parliaments to prevent it and counter it through an appropriate policy and a legislative framework.

The conference is open to parliamentarians from Romania, Bulgaria, Hungary, the Republic of Moldova and Serbia, as well as representatives from governmental and non-governmental organisations, civil society and experts. It will highlight the added value of the Istanbul Convention and try to address possible obstacles to its signature and ratification by the countries concerned. As of 5 November, the Serbian parliament has completed the ratification process; Bulgaria, Hungary, Moldova and Romania have not yet signed the Convention.
